

COLLABORATION AGREEMENT

This Collaboration Agreement is made at New Delhi on 4th June, 2025 ("Agreement") by and between:

IDP Education India Private Limited, a company incorporated under the provisions of Companies Act, 1956, having its registered office at Suit No. 610-616, 6th Floor International Trade Tower, Nehru Place, New Delhi, South Delhi - 110019 and corporate office at 5, 6 & 7 Floor, Tower B, Global Gateway Towers, Sikanderpur Ghosi, Sector-26, M.G Road, Gurgaon- 122002, represented by its Regional Finance Director, Mr. Rupesh Sharma (hereinafter referred to as "IDP" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns) of the FIRST PART;

AND

Wainganga College Of Engineering And Management, an education institution, having its address at Dongargaon, near Gumgaon Rly. Station, Post - Gumgaon, Wardha Road, Nagpur, Maharashtra, 441114, hereinafter referred to as "Institution" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns) of the SECOND PART

IDP and Institution shall hereinafter collectively be referred to as "Parties" and individually as "Party".

WHEREAS:

- A. IDP is engaged in the business of providing international education services. It also administers the prestigious International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test in India.
- B. Institution being committed to educational excellence, offers courses in multiple disciplines to the students.
- C. The Parties desirous of collaborating with each other for promoting overseas education and IELTS test, have agreed to enter into this arrangement whereby Institution shall refer its students interested in availing international education placement services provided by IDP for studying abroad in English-speaking countries such as Australia, New Zealand, Canada, the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Ireland, and other destinations that may be added by IDP in the future, as well as IELTS administered by IDP in India ("Products"), on the terms as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1) Scope: Institution shall refer their students interested in availing the Products to IDP.
- 2) Referral Benefits: In consideration of the students referred by Institution to IDP, the Parties have agreed to the scholarships, discounts and other benefits, as outlined in Annexure A of this Agreement.
- 3) Representations and Warranties: Each Party represents and warrants that:
 - (a) It is duly incorporated and validly existing under Indian law and possesses the authority to carry on its business in India.
 - (b) It has full authority, including requisite corporate approvals, to enter into, execute, deliver, and perform its obligations under this Agreement.
 - (c) This Agreement constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation enforceable against it in accordance with the terms hereof.
 - (d) It shall not make commitments or representations on behalf of the other Party without express written authorization.
 - (e) Entering into this Agreement and fulfilling the obligations herein does not breach any obligations under any other agreement.
- Compliance: Each Party shall be responsible for compliance with applicable laws, rules and regulations.
- 5) Confidentiality
- 5.1 Neither Party shall, during the term of this Agreement or any time thereafter, use or disclose to any third party any Confidential Information of the other Party. "Confidential Information" refers to any information disclosed or

obtained by either Party under this Agreement, whether written, oral, or in any other form, whether or not marked as 'confidential'. This includes information about the Parties or their group companies, customers, clients, suppliers, and third parties, including but not limited to personally identifiable information of the students, business affairs, strategies, marketing, and other business activities. Each Party agrees to take all appropriate measures to safeguard and protect the Confidential Information against unauthorized disclosure, misuse, loss, and theft, and shall not, without prior written consent, disclose or use any Confidential Information for its own benefit or gain.

The Parties shall ensure that access to Confidential Information is limited to those authorized representatives of such Party who need to know such Confidential Information in connection with this Agreement. The Parties shall also ensure that restrictions not less stringent than the ones under this Agreement shall be enforced upon such authorized representatives to ensure that Confidential Information shall be used only for the purpose of performing its obligations under this Agreement.

The Parties acknowledge and agree that Confidential Information of each Party is unique and valuable to each Party 5.3 respectively, and that breach of the confidentiality obligations provided herein may cause substantial, immediate and irreparable damage to the non-defaulting Party for which monetary damages alone would not be an adequate remedy. Upon any such breach, or in the event that the non-defaulting Party forms a reasonable and good faith belief that such a breach is imminent, non-defaulting Party shall be entitled to seek preliminary and other injunctive relief. This remedy shall be in addition to any and all other rights or remedies to which non-defaulting Party may

be entitled at law or in equity.

The Parties shall comply with all applicable data protection and privacy laws and regulations and shall implement appropriate technical and organizational measures to ensure the security, confidentiality, and integrity of personally identifiable data of the individuals.

The confidentiality obligations of the Parties shall survive expiry or termination of this Agreement. 5.5

6) Intellectual Property Rights

Each Party, including its group companies and respective right holders (as the case may be) shall retain exclusive 6.1 ownership of its respective Intellectual Property Rights worldwide and in perpetuity. Neither Party shall: (a) acquire any rights, title, or interest in the Intellectual Property Rights of the other Party or its respective right holders; nor (b) claim or assert any rights, title, or interest in the Intellectual Property Rights of the other Party or its respective right holders, nor take any action that would impair the rights, title, or interest of the other Party or its respective right holders in their Intellectual Property Rights.

Neither Party shall use the Intellectual Property of the other Party or its respective right holders without prior 6.2 written consent. If permitted, such use shall be strictly limited to the scope and purpose as expressly specified in

writing and solely for fulfilling the obligations of this Agreement.

Institution shall use promotional materials provided by IDP, solely for promoting Products to students in the 6.3

manner explicitly outlined by IDP in writing.

- Institution and IDP shall mutually agree on any co-branding activities prior to their implementation. Both Parties 6.4 shall collaboratively review and approve the use of branding elements ensuring that all marketing and promotional content featuring either Party's brand is in accordance with agreed-upon specifications. Any materials intended for publication or distribution must receive prior written consent from both Parties.
- Force Majeure: Neither Party shall be considered to be in default of performance of its obligations under the 7) terms of this Agreement, if such performance is prevented or delayed for reasons of Force Majeure event which is defined as any event beyond the reasonable control of the affected Party, including but not limited to acts of the government authorities, government-imposed restrictions, pandemic, epidemic, acts of God, fire, flood, explosion, riots, war, rebellion, insurrection and sabotage. The Parties shall forthwith resume their duties and obligations under this Agreement upon the cessation of the Force Majeure event.

8) Term, Termination and Consequences

This Agreement shall come into force from the date of this Agreement and remain in force for a period of two (2) 8.1 years, unless terminated earlier by the Parties in writing. The Parties may agree in writing to renew this Agreement on such terms as may be mutually agreed between the Parties.

11) Miscellaneous:

- 11.1 Notices: All notices or other communication to be provided under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed sufficiently given if delivered personally with acknowledgement of receipt or sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the address of Institution as contained in the Agreement and in case of IDP, at its corporate office address mentioned first herein above.
- 11.2 Entire Agreement: This Agreement along with the annexures constitute the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter forming part hereof and supersedes all communications (whether written or oral) between the Parties with respect hereto made prior to the date of this Agreement.
- 11.3 Amendment: This Agreement can be amended or modified only by way of written instrument signed by both Parties.
- 11.4 Severability: If any provision or condition of this Agreement is prohibited or rendered invalid or unenforceable, such prohibition, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provisions of this Agreement.
- 11.5 Relationship between the Parties: Both the Parties agree and acknowledge that they shall perform their obligations pursuant to this Agreement as an independent contractor and that this Agreement neither creates an employer-employee relationship between the Parties nor constitute an agency or partnership between the Parties.

- C) The Parties intent to co-operate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of internship, Skill Based Training Education.

NOW THERFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

1.1 MEMBERS:

An Executive Committee consisting of 05 Members, 03 from institute and 02 from Sharada Academy for Foreign Accents and Linguistics shall be constituted. The Wainganga College of Engineering and Management, Nagpur (WCEM) shall be represented by the Principal and two nominees from the institute. The Sharada Academy for Foreign Accents and Linguistics will be represented by the two members that will be decided by Sharada Academy for Foreign Accents and Linguistics who are accountable for the implementation and the decision taken by the Executive Committee. The Sharada Academy for Foreign Accents and Linguistics shall inform the name and the designation of the two members. Membership of those appointed to the Executive Committee by virtue of the office they hold shall be terminated when they cease to hold the office.

- 1.4.2 The secretary shall take initiatives to convey the meetings. The members shall be given at least a notice of not less than 7 days before the days of meeting along with agenda.
- 1.4.3 The chairperson will preside over the meetings. In his / her absence, his / her nominee will preside over.
- 1.4.4 The secretary, will preside the minutes and send to the same to the members within 7 days from the day of meeting.
- 1.4.5 And temporary vacancy of members of the Executive committee shall not any way invalidate the action / decision taken by the Executive committee.
- 1.4.6 The required quorum for the meeting is 3 members. Chairperson or secretary any one should remain present.





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

The ASSOCIATE shall provide a workshop/bootcamp/innovation program as per company norms to students and staff of the INSTITUTE.

The ASSOCIATE shall provide 3-6 months internship programs to the students of INSTITUTION Paid or Unpaid.

Joint Responsibilities

Marketing & mobilization of the students shall be carried out jointly as per mutually agreed terms.

Promotion for the programmes undertaken shall be advertised/ propagated through the respective websites of the parties.

Technical workshops/ promotional workshops within the scope of the MOU.

Assessment of the courses shall be carried out jointly by both the parties.

ASSOCIATE shall provide internships to the students for their academic career to fulfilthe university curriculum either onthe campus of the INSTITUTE or on ASSOCIATE premises.

Financial Agreement

Course fees shall be decided in mutual agreement by both the training partners for all the programs to be conducted jointly by The Institution with **SkillshipFoundation**

The institute will decide whether the fees decided by the ASSOCIATE shall be collected from the students or not.

Before training 50% payment shall be advanced by INSTITUTION, then ASSOCIATE can start training.

The INSTITUTION shall not be liable for discharging any financial commitments made by the ASSOCIATE and vice-versa.

Students will not be charged any course fees or any other financial charges.

Duration and Termination of Agreement

MOU shall be effective from the date of signing and shall remain in force for a period of 2 Year. It shall automatically be renewed for next year until & unless discontinued

by either party or it can be discontinued if the Institute fails to execute any event or Development Program within 6 months of MoU Duration.

The INSTITUTION has the right to terminate the agreement for non-performance of the ASSOCIATE, based on half-yearly detailed reviews.

In case the ASSOCIATE intends to terminate the contract, it shall communicate the INSTITUTION six months in advance and in addition, it shall meet all its obligations for the running or announced batches. In case of even a long duration batch (if any), it is an obligation of the ASSOCIATE to make it successful.

General Provisions

Both the Parties have full power and authority to enter into this MOU and take any action execute any documents required by the terms hereof; and that this MOU, entered into has been duly and validly executed and delivered, and is a legal, valid, and binding obligation, enforceable in accordance with the terms hereof; and that the executants of this MOU are duly empowered and authorized to execute this MOU and to perform all its obligations in accordance with the terms herein.

This agreement shall not be binding for any other agreement for either party. Parties shall be free and independent to carry on other services and training besides that covered under the scope of this agreement.

The ASSOCIATE & The INSTITUTION shall perform their duties in strict compliance with all applicable laws in India along with rules and regulations of duly constituted Govt. authorities in India and shall obtain all licenses, restrictions or other approval, if any, required by laws in India in connection with the services to be rendered hereunder.

The ASSOCIATE shall strictly follow the INSTITUTION norms, rules and regulations for conducting the programs and shall maintain the INSTITUTION high standards.

Both parties can use logo, trade name, course modules & other related materials for promotion of the courses to be conducted jointly within the scope of this MOU.

Both parties shall promote the arrangement and courses through respective websites

Notices

Unless otherwise provided herein, all notices or other communications under or in connection with this MOU shall be given in writing and may be sent by personal delivery or post or courier or facsimile. Any such notice or other communication will be deemed to be effective if sent by personal delivery, when delivered if sent by post, two days after being deposited in the post and if sent by courier, one day

after being deposited with the courier, & if sent by facsimile when sent (on receipt of confirmation to the correct facsimile number).

Arbitration

In the event of a dispute between the ASSOCIATE and The INSTITUTION arising out of, or relating to this Agreement, its interpretation or performance hereunder, the parties shall exert their best efforts to resolve the dispute amicably through negotiations.

In case of any disagreement and dispute and the parties fail to mutually resolve the issue; both parties shall appoint an Arbitrator that is mutually agreeable and shall be settled as per the Indian Arbitration Act, and arbitrator charges shall be paid by individual party.

Further, in case the parties fail to resolve the dispute; this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law within the state of Maharashtra, India. The jurisdiction shall be the Court of Nagpur Maharashtra.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, each of the parties hereto has caused this Agreement to be duly executed by a duly authorized representative of such party as of the date first above written.

Confidentiality

This agreement is valid for a period of one year from the date of disclosure/approval, each party agrees to consider as confidential all information disclosed by both parties and will be extended thereafter on mutual consent.
